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## Ken & Karen's Story

In 2008 Ken and Karen Buckner joined a mission team from Myrtle Beach, South Carolina to visit an orphanage in Zambia. Little did they know that they would be answering a lifetime call to missions while on that trip. By the next summer they were working with Global Samaritans Children's Home. For the next 3 years they became fully funded as full-time missionaries as they began learning about life on the mission field, the orphanage, hosting mission teams and ministering in the rural areas of Zambia - sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It was this work that propelled them to the next phase of their ministry as God directed them to pursue full time work in "Bush Ministry". In 2013 the Buckners left GSO and began a rural Ministry program based in Livingstone, Zambia. It was then that God led them to the perfect place to live and base this new ministry. The Come Go With Us Guesthouse is located 5 kilometers from Victoria Falls - one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. The CGWU Guesthouse is easily capable of supporting mission teams with as many as 20 members. It is located in the bush, while only 5 minutes from town.

Ken & Karen's ministry is to take the Gospel to the people who live in the Zambian Bush. Hampered by a culture steeped in witchcraft and animism, the Gospel represents the only hope they have. Because this part of the world is so "dark", the light of the Gospel is received without hesitation. Outreach consists of evangelism, daily lessons for men and women; vacation Bible School for children and training for Pastors. The \*Jesus Film is a tool they use to help get the message to the people.

*\*(the Jesus Film, by Campus Crusade for Christ, is the story of the life of Jesus Christ translated in the local language).*

The majority of the Buckners work is done on BUSH TRIPS - usually 2 - 3 days in length. Most trips take place within 3-8 hours from Livingstone. On these trips they live and work among the people as they share the Good News to the lost. Other ministry activities include - but is not limited to - one-day "Day Camps" in the various local schools. Starting in the afternoon the students are provided "Vacation Bible School" - followed by a hot meal and a presentation of the Jesus Film, which is open to their families as well as the whole community that evening. The night is capped off with a presentation of the Gospel and an invitation to join the Family of God.

***The Buckners are seeking Mission Teams, Interns and other Missionaries to join them in this ministry.*** *There are many villages and people in this area...and they can only accomplish so much by themselves. They need assistance working with men, women and children; helping to rebuild churches and fallen homes for widows and delivering needed humanitarian supplies and Bibles to those in need. Pastor training is extremely vital. Pastors are encouraged to come with the team and assist in the Pastor Training programs.*

A mission team can expect to work in the bush a majority of their time in Zambia. There is ample opportunity to hone your soul winning skills, teaching and leading services, etc. Camping is an OPTION (not mandatory). We have ample camping supplies and are bringing in more as needed. Your trip will not be complete without the opportunity to see African animals in a nearby "world class" game preserve as well as a visit to Victoria Falls. There is also a chance to see and purchase local souvenirs and artwork.

The opportunity to Come Go With Us on the mission field is both rewarding and satisfying - not only to those who take the trip, but to the Buckners and the Zambians as well. Thank you for considering this ministry challenge.

## About Come, Go With Us

Come, go With Us was founded by Ken & Karen Buckner and was recognized as a 501 ©(3) non-profit corporation in 2008. Based in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, CGWU serves as a missionary sending organization.

In late 2014, Come Go With Us Zambia Limited was established as non-profit NGO aimed at promoting missions, evangelizing, training and working with widows and orphans. Under CGWU Zambia, mission teams are recognized as temporary fellow missionaries and are welcome to assist the organization. CGWU Zambia can also host missionaries on a temporary or full-time basis and welcomes summer interns to assist in the work of hosting mission teams.

As God continues to lead, it is the aim of CGWU to continue to fulfill the Matthew 28:19 and Acts 1:8 mandates to take the Gospel all over the world. If that leads us to other countries or lands, CGWU is willing to be obedient in that calling.

# About a Zambian Mission Trip with CGWU

## SAFETY

Zambia is a safe country to visit. Most Zambians are peaceful and respectful of you as a visitor. Although Zambia is considered a Christian nation, there is much darkness and there are many who have never heard of Jesus Christ. And if they have, they know very little about Him. They are hungry for the Truth and, therefore, are very receptive to the Gospel. There is no need to fear for your safety while in the bush, any more than you would in the rural areas of the United States. Although, it is always prudent to be in prayer and remain alert.

## POLITICS

Zambia is a democracy. While they continue to strive to catch up with the modern world, they have a long way to go. That is evident in the services and infrastructure you observe throughout the country. The continuing strides include improvements in electricity, water, telecommunications, internet, etc. but are nowhere near the levels you are accustomed to in the USA. There are sometimes frequent power outages/interruptions, limited resources and a very slow Internet. The best mindset is to not expect much and rejoice when the minimum is available.

## TRANSPORTATION

Most roads, except for the main routes are "horrible". Traveling in the bush is not like "off road" travel...**IT IS "off road" travel.** We use a Toyota Land Cruiser – the strongest vehicle available at an affordable price. The rides can be long and "bumpy" (you might use a stronger word). Break downs are rare as we spend what we need to keep the vehicle in top operating condition using high end suspension and other major parts. Regular servicing is mandatory – although very expensive.

## COMMUNICATIONS / INTERNET

Communications are less than satisfactory, but you **CAN** expect to be able to reach your loved ones from time to time via. phone, texting, Facebook, email, etc. – all the usual means. But due to the unreliable nature of these services, you can also EXPECT these communications to be SLOW, WEAK, ROUGH and sometimes unavailable – with SLOW being the most common description. Unlimited Internet has not yet reached Zambia. Everything costs by the unit and must be pre-paid. Not expecting a modern experience will keep you grounded and receptive to the experience God has in store for you on your upcoming mission trip. There is no need to invest in expensive international telecommunications (unless you choose to do so). We can provide inexpensive cell phone connections. "Talk Time" (what they call cell phone time here) is very cheap. Calls to the USA **can be** as little as pennies...and texting is even cheaper.

## **WEATHER**

The climate is very mild compared to the USA. During the months from March through November there **IS NO RAIN**. The temperatures are generally in the 70's to 90's during the day and 40's to 60's at night with very low humidity – less than 25%. A light jacket is good; it just depends on your “cold or hot” nature

## **WILDLIFE**

It is very rare to see wild animals in the places where we go in the bush. Most all of Africa has poached the wild animals, which are now only seen in game preserves. The exception is near our house. We live very close to a small game preserve and sometimes we see Elephants, Cape Buffalo, Kudu, Impala and Baboons near our place. As long as we are observant and do not attempt to interfere with these animals, there is little or no danger. This typically happens between May - September; although it is possible to happen at any time. However, you WILL see numerous quantities of free roaming wild life when we go on the Safari.

## **SNAKES**

There are snakes in Zambia. They are here and some of them are deadly. As it is anywhere (America included) you must be alert and careful. Most of them are in a big hurry to get away from you. We will provide additional information and precautionary steps to remain safe against these and other pests when you arrive. However, don't be surprised if you never see a snake while you are here.

## **THE GUESTHOUSE**

The guesthouse you will be staying in is a large brick home with 4 large bedrooms that sleeps up to 20 and can accommodate more. There are 4 full baths with ample room for gathering in the living room or outside in our Lapa (Zambian style shelter with cone shaped grass roof.) There is a large yard with plenty of trees and sitting areas – great for getting some alone time with God.

## **WATER**

The water that we serve is safe to drink. It either comes from a well or from the store as bottled water. When we travel into the bush we take plenty of water with us. It is NOT advisable to drink in the villages due to the fact that many times the water does not come from sanitary places. Since we cannot always know the condition of the water, we simply DO NOT DRINK water in the bush.

## **FOOD**

Most of the food you will eat will be familiar to you. However, the cultural diet here is a bit different than in the USA. Primarily, they live on Nshima (pronounced "sheema") – a type of ground corn meal that is made into a grits -like consistency. EVERY Zambian meal features Nshima and a vegetable and/or meat "relish". You will have the opportunity to sample Zambian food, but you will not be required to partake – it will be your choice. But it is pretty good. You will NOT have to eat bugs, insects, worms or other (feared) African delicacies...unless you want to.

## **Necessary Rooms**

Toilet facilities in the bush are primitive. Think of the old time "outhouse" and you will be pretty close to imagining what is available in the bush – most of the time...sometimes – even less than that.

## **MINISTRY IN THE BUSH**

On most trips we will be visiting villages and usually base our operations at a local BUSH CHURCH if they have one. The people will greet us and we will begin to organize our "program"; vacation Bible School and/or grouping with the men and women for Bible lessons. We will let you know the topics that we need taught at the various locations so you can come prepared to teach/minister. There will be opportunities to preach, pray for those who want to accept Jesus Christ, pray for the sick, baptize and teach. You will also have ample time to mingle with the people and develop relationships that will last a lifetime. Their culture will be on full display and you will have the opportunity to see a completely different way of life from the way they cook, raise their children, treat their guests, worship, pray, sing, etc. You WILL BE changed!

## **FUN TIME**

There will be an opportunity to take in the beauty and majesty of Africa from the largest water falls in the world to a game park that has nearly every African animal on display - including over 100,000 elephants. Victoria Falls (one of the 7 Natural Wonders of the World) is within 10 minutes of the town of Livingstone- making it a tourist town which attracts artisans and merchants selling artifacts, crafts, paintings, beaded jewelry, drums, animal figurines, etc. You will have a chance to visit at least 2 different souvenir markets while you are here. You can purchase what you like and have the opportunity to learn the art of African negotiations.

# THINGS YOU WILL NEED TO BRING WITH YOU

## Passport:

If you do not have a passport, you will have to get one. Give yourself plenty of time: When applying for an American passport, you will need your birth certificate and two 2x2 color passport photos. The cost for your passport will be approximately \$100. Check online to find the nearest location and timetable for application or go your local post office and inquire.

## At Zambia Airport:

Upon entering Zambia, it is imperative that you

**GET A BUSINESS VISA...not a Tourist VISA...**

**It can be a single entry (\$50) or a double entry (\$80). Most likely you will need a double entry VISA as we usually take a trip to Botswana for the Safari...which will require a second entry into the country on our return.**

*Zambia is open to sharing the Gospel so there is no need to mask your intentions.*

## CDC Recommended Shots

Please note: all of the immunizations below are “suggested” by the CDC. It is important for you to consult your doctor and the CDC website to be sure you receive the correct immunizations before your trip to Zambia. Immunizations can be obtained from your doctor or your local health department. There are some companies that specialize in travel related immunizations

- Hepatitis A and B vaccine - this vaccine consists of three shots. After the first shot is given, the second is administered a month later, and then, the last at six months. These vaccines are good for life.
- Often, Yellow fever vaccines are required for travel to and from Zambia and South Africa.
- Make sure your Tetanus is current. You need a booster every ten years.
- Typhoid vaccine - this vaccine is taken orally. It consists of four pills taken every other day. It provides five years of coverage.
- Anti-malaria tablets are available in the USA. There are about 3 different regiments. You should consult your doctor to determine the best choice for you.

## **COSTS:**

While we do not charge for your visit, there are certain costs that are generated as a result of your trip. As a non-profit organization, we appreciate your tax free donations to cover these costs.

## **PACKING**

Depending on the baggage requirements, you could be allowed to bring either 1 or 2 checked bags with 1 carry on and a handbag or purse. See your airlines for specifications.

The best way to get supplies and/or items we cannot get here in Zambia is to have teams bring them in their checked baggage. We will provide you a list of items we need, or we will ship necessary items to you prior to your “packing party”. The more personal items you pack in your carry-on, the more space you will have in your checked bags to help bring in supplies.

## What to pack

- We wash clothes here so you will only need 2-3 changes of clothes.
- Temperatures should be similar to Fall weather in the Southeast, USA.
- Short sleeve shirts, tee shirts and light jackets should be ok.
- We do not have heat in the house so, warm pajamas could come in handy.
- Remember the days here are sunny with NO CLOUDS from May through September.
- Don't forget your sun screen, hat and sunglasses.
- 2 pairs of comfortable shoes.
- Toiletries for 2 weeks
- Extra memory cards for your camera
- Flash light
- Water Bottle
- Batteries
- Snacks for your personal use...and snacks to share with the team (if you choose).

## ITEMS WE NEED

Sometimes, there are items that cannot be purchased or acquired here but can be brought along with your team. As time goes on, this list changes. A current **"NEEDS LIST"** is available on request. There are certain items we could use if the team is willing to bring. These items are not mandatory, but help makes life go a bit more "Americanish":

## **DRESS**

Casual dress is acceptable at all times. Ladies/girls are asked NOT to wear shorts above the knee as it is unacceptable in the Zambian culture – especially in the bush. All women should plan on wearing long skirts or the traditional “Chetenge”. Chetenges can be obtained in Zambia for about \$5 each. ALL Zambian women in the bush wear some type of tee shirt, blouse or top and a Chetenge skirt – a simple wrap around piece of cloth worn from the waist to the feet. We will have Chetenges available at the guesthouse for you to purchase if you choose.

AS ALWAYS: “Modesty is the best policy.”

## **FUN THINGS TO DO**

Because this is a tourist area there is a number of FUN activities available. Due to fluctuating pricing, you should budget the estimated cost for each item to be \$165 +/- \$35.

- **Micro Flight** – an ultra-light flight over Victoria Falls and the local game park
- **Elephant Walk / Lion Walk** – up close and personal touch experience. The Elephant walk is actually an Elephant ride through the bush.
- **The Crocodile Farm** – plenty of giant “Crocs” in a Zoo like environment
- **Ride the African Queen** – A riverboat ride up the Zambezi and through the Game Park to view the African sunset while munching on plenty of tasty Hors d'oeuvres.
- **Bungee Jumping/Zip Line** - from the Bridge over the Zambezi Gorge at Victoria Falls.
- **Ride the Bush Tracks train** through the game park and get a 5-course meal. There are other adventures – call for options.

## Statement of Faith

### **GOD**

We believe there is one living and true God who is the creator and ruler of all things. He exists in 3 distinct personalities – Father, Son, Holy Spirit. These 3 are co-equal and comprise the one true God.

### **MAN**

We believe that man was created as a direct act of God and that he was made in His spiritual image. He is the supreme object of God's creation. Man fell by voluntary transgression from his state of innocence to an eternal condition of punishment and death – separated from God without defense or excuse.

### **FALL OF MAN**

We believe that man was created in the image of God and was free from sin, that he sinned against God and thereby incurred physical, spiritual and eternal death which is separation from God...and that, as a consequence, all human beings are born with a sinful nature – opposed to God and His law, are sinners by choice, and are under condemnation.

### **JESUS**

We believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born through a virgin birth, lived a sinless life and communicated God's will for mankind through his teachings. He is co-equal with God, the Father and the Holy Spirit. He lived a sinless human life and offered himself a living sacrifice for our sins by dying on the cross. He arose from the dead after 3 days to demonstrate his power over sin and death. He ascended to heaven's glory and will return to earth as King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

### **HOLY SPIRIT**

We believe that the Holy Spirit is equal with the Father and the Son of God. We believe the Holy Spirit was sent by the Father and the Son to convict the world of sin, and to regenerate, sanctify, and empower all who believe in Jesus Christ. We also believe He indwells in every believer in Christ from the moment of salvation, and that HE is an abiding helper, teacher and guide.

### **BIBLE**

We believe the Holy Bible is the unerring word of God. It was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. We believe the Bible is the supreme revelation of God's will for man and constitutes the ONLY infallible guide for faith and life.

### **SALVATION**

Salvation is God's gift to man. Only in Jesus Christ by God's forgiveness can man be saved from sin's penalty. We believe that eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ (through forgiveness) in his life by faith. Because God gives man eternal life through the salvation of Jesus Christ, the believer is secure in salvation for eternity.

## **BAPTISM**

One of the 2 distinct ordinances from Jesus Christ is Baptism. Baptism symbolizes the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ and is your public declaration that you have accepted Jesus Christ as your personal savior. It does not save you but shows the world that you have been saved. While Baptism is not required for salvation, it is a biblical command and demonstrates your love and obedience to Christ.

## **COMMUNION**

Another of 2 distinct ordinances from Jesus Christ is Communion. Communion (The Lords Supper) is an ordinance given to all believers by Jesus Christ to remember his sacrifice and to symbolize the new covenant. The elements of bread and wine (or juice) are symbols of Christ's broken body and His shed blood. Communion is not a means of salvation. Rather, it is a testament of a believer's faith in the atoning work of the cross.

## **TRINITY**

We believe that God, from eternity, exists in three persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit, that these (3) are without division of nature, essence or being and are fully equal in every way.

## **CHRIST'S RETURN**

We believe in the personal and visible return of the Lord Jesus Christ to earth and the establishment of His eternal kingdom. We believe in the final judgment, the eternal joy of the righteous and the endless suffering of the wicked.

## **ETERNITY**

Man was created to exist forever. He will either exist eternally in union with God through forgiveness and salvation or separated from God through sin and the rejection of salvation.
